



Rotorua District

A partnership between Creative New Zealand and the Rotorua District Council, the Creative Communities Rotorua Scheme's primary focus is to stimulate and provide support for arts and culture projects, which increase participation, the range and diversity of activities and interests in the arts across the community. Allocates approximately \$40,000 per year. Maximum for grants is usually \$2,500.00.

Rotorua District Council is responsible for ensuring that a representative committee is formed to assess applications for funding.

What is generally funded: Projects which increase participation in arts and culture. Mainly supports groups / organisations although individuals can apply.

What is not funded: Does not fund capital items

Area Covered: Projects must be in the Rotorua District

When to apply: The main funding round opens in February and distributes approximately \$30,000.00. A discretionary round opens in September and distributes approximately \$4,000.00.

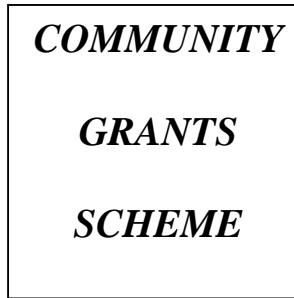

COMMUNITY ASSET DEVELOPMENT FUND

Supports the development of facilities for Community, Cultural, Arts as well as Sporting and Recreational Groups. Applicants must show a **proven community need** for the facility (asset) to be established or upgraded

- What is generally funded:** The focus is for
- Capital works, being the purchase of a new, or the replacement of an existing asset (this can include additions to an existing asset)
 - School Based community assets will be able to be accepted under certain criteria
 - Marae based assets will be able to be accepted under certain criteria

Council provides up to a one-third grant, or a two third loan for eligible projects

What is not funded: A range of activities cannot be funded. Contact the Community Projects Officer for more information

Area Covered: Projects must be in the Rotorua District

When to apply: Applications open at the beginning of September and close at the end of October. Applications are considered by the Community Parks and Recreation Committee at the end of February and applicants notified in early March
